The story of the image is as follows: "Jalbu .. that's language for girl, woman .. both. See us today ... we're new style, modern. We like games, modern dress... go to shops .. go to work. Inside of us tradition is still strong. Jalbu, Jalbu ..we like to dance for Aboriginal people ...traditional dance .. body paint ... traditional dress. People who don't know and don't understand ... they see us and think we're the same.
